For a season opener in early September, Lake Stevens coach Tom Tri and Keith Ross, the coach of defending Class 4A champion Sumner, spent an awful lot of time studying each other — and putting an opponent-specific game plan in place.

The investment certainly contributed to one of the best games of the fall — a last-second Vikings' 31-28 victory in Lake Stevens.

An encore? You bet.

For 50 years, no two previous Class 4A State Football Champions ever played each other in a WIAA title game.

Now, it will happen for the second time in three seasons when 2023 state champion Lake Stevens meets the Spartans for the 4A crown Saturday night at Husky Stadium.

"It's pretty amazing," Ross said. "We play in Week 1 and Week 14. We have the utmost respect for them. Tom Tri is a great coach and a great offensive mind. He is hard to game-plan against ... but we are excited to have a chance to get back at them."

Payback seems to be a theme for these two powerhouses.

After the Vikings won the second of back-to-back 4A championships in 2023 over Graham-Kapowsin, they opened last season traveling to Sumner.

The Spartans won, 31-28, in overtime in a game that kick-started their championship march to Husky Stadium.

All of this added more fuel to their opening-week clash this fall — and their close-the-season finale Saturday.

"Really, I'd prefer not to be playing them, to be honest," Tri said

with a chuckle. "That is how good they are. And you can see they were hungry and executed very well against (No. 1 seed) Puyallup (in the State Semifinals).

"I had a feeling we'd probably see them again."

Second-seeded Lake Stevens defeated No. 15 Kamiakin in the first round (55-14), No. 7 Moses Lake in the quarterfinals (76-41) and No. 6 Graham-Kapowsin in the semifinals (44-35).

It's been 45 years since Mount Tahoma High School held up a state trophy for capturing a WIAA Football Championship.

It's been seemingly 45 minutes since O'Dea and longtime coach Monte Kohler shocked top-seeded Bellevue to win the Class 3A title last December.

Never mind the programs' stark contrast in championship time periods — the No. 2 seed Thunderbirds and No. 1 seed Irish are closer than you think in on-field capabilities.

And both share primary common denominators: Run the football and let your defense dictate the action.

"They are big. They are fast. Offensively, they are really dangerous in so many areas," Kohler said of the Thunderbirds.

O'Dea and Mount Tahoma — the 50th different team a Kohler-led squad has faced in the WIAA playoffs — played last season in the State Quarterfinals. The Irish scored four first-half touchdowns, including a pair of scores by all-state running back Uriah Stringfield — and defeated Mount Tahoma, 42-21.

Thunderbirds coach Keith Terry will remind his returners this week about how competitive the second half of that loss was — and the lessons learned from facing O'Dea for the first time.

"For us, it is huge that we've played them ... because the surprise element is gone," Terry said. "We know what it takes to compete with them — and what it will take to have a chance to win."

While the Thunderbirds are coming off a dominant 21-6 state-semifinal victory over Eastside Catholic — the Irish's chief rival in the 3A Metro League — O'Dea needed a late defensive stand to hold off Bellevue, 20-14.

The Irish had three turnovers and gained just 183 yards.

"Sometimes we can't get out of our own way," Kohler said. "We've got to play better, that's all there is to it."

Top-seeded O'Dea defeated No. 16 Ferndale in the first round (49-0), No. 8 Sedro-Woolley in the quarterfinals (56-21) and No. 4 Bellevue in the semifinals (20-14).

Tumwater's rich WIAA football playoff history is undeniable.

Now only have the Thunderbirds won six state championships, they are the only program in Washington high school history to capture titles in the three highest classifications (4A, 3A, 2A).

On Saturday, they will play in their 10th state championship game at the Class 2A level, tying Lynden for most ever. And Tumwater will become the second school in classification history to play in three consecutive WIAA title games.

And yet, most pundits would consider Tumwater an underdog. Why?

It's because of how dominant No. 1 seed Archbishop Murphy has been this fall.

The Wildcats have scored 43 or more points in each of their victories. In 11 of their 12 wins, they invoked the WIAA's 40-point mercy rule, meaning the game finishes up on a running clock.

"Yeah, it's fair to say (we're the underdog) based on the way they've played over the past three months," Tumwater coach Willie Garrow said. "It is not the same roster we played against over a year ago."

Indeed, what Archbishop Murphy has assembled is one of the best collections of college-level talent the classification has ever seen — led by seniors Henry Gabalis (Arizona commit), Jack Sievers (Wisconsin) and Hakeim Smalls (Boise State).

But don't count out the Thunderbirds, who have two important things working in their favor Saturday: Familiarity and recent success.

In Archbishop Murphy's past eight appearances in the WIAA playoffs, it has played Wing-T counterpart Tumwater. The Wildcats are 2-6 in those games, including a 42-0 loss in last season's state semifinals.

"They are definitely a 'blue blood' in 2A ... and Willie does such a great job," Archbishop Murphy coach Joe Cronin said. "They are super well-coached, and it shows."

Coaches: Willie Garrow is in his third season at Tumwater (39-3 record; 45-27 record overall). Joe Cronin is in his third season at Archbishop Murphy (28-6 record; 43-12 record overall).

WIAA State Championship History: Tumwater won the 3A title in 1987, 1989 and 1990, the 4A title in 1993 and the 2A title in 2010 and 2019. Archbishop Murphy won the 1A title in 2002 and 2003, and the 2A title in 2016.

Road to 2025 Gridiron Classic: Second-seeded Tumwater defeated No. 15 Washougal in the first round (47-6), No. 7 Franklin Pierce in the quarterfinals (27-6) and No. 3 East Valley of Yakima in the semifinals (42-0). Top-seeded Archbishop Murphy defeated No. 16 Olympic in the first round (45-13), No. 9 Sehome in the quarterfinals (52-20) and No. 5 Anacortes in the semifinals (59-17).



At long glance, many would consider the hill too steep to climb in Class 1A football in Washington.

Standing as the giant of the small schools is Royal High School, the five-time defending state champion.

How dominant have the Knights been? They are currently on a 47-game winning streak, which would rank No. 4 all-time in Washington high school football — and No. 2 in program history (they won 53 in a row from 2015-18).

Royal has also won its past 21 WIAA playoff games — and 35 of its past 36.

And yet, as the Knights come to Husky Stadium on Friday in search of their unprecedented sixth consecutive State Championship, their opponent has all the makings of spoiling the party.

Get ready for another round of No. 1 Royal-vs.-No. 2 Cashmere.

“I am not surprised they are in it,” Royal coach Wiley Allred said. “They’ve definitely become a formidable rival. (Coach Bryan Bremer) has done a good job, and he has a bunch of good kids.”

If you think Allred is playing possum and being polite, you certainly weren’t at the first game between the two 1A SCAC teams this season.

In Week 5, Cashmere led well into the fourth quarter before the Knights rallied for a 21-15 overtime victory on their home field in Royal City.

Even though it was the Bulldogs’ fourth consecutive loss to Royal since 2015, this outcome felt different. It felt as if Cashmere had finally reached near the top of that hill.

“It’s a be-careful-what-you-ask-for thing by wanting to play Royal again, and we have our work cut out for us,” Bremer said. “But we get our second chance. They have really good football players ... but obviously we feel confident that we belong.”

Even though Toledo High School and Tri-Cities Prep are separated by nearly 100 years in age, more than 200 miles in location and play football in different leagues and districts, the two Class 2B programs do share a ton in common.

Both run out of the Wing-T formation to get their twitchy athletes in space — and aren't afraid to pass the football out of it. Both have a powerfully-built running back plowing behind offensive lines built on quickness and work rate over brawn.

And their most welcomed similarity? The No. 1 seed Riverhawks and No. 3 seed Jaguars are playing Saturday for the 2B championship at Husky Stadium.

“Honestly, I think we are facing each other because we are comparable,” Tri-Cities Prep coach Kyle Cairns said. “The difference is I am conservative in my play-calling approach, and (Toledo coach) Mike (Christensen) is aggressive.”

And both programs share recent playoff history together.

Two seasons ago, the teams met in the WIAA first round in Kelso — and the Riverhawks earned a 21-12 victory. That is when Christensen began connecting the dots on the immediate future of both teams at the state level.

“When we knocked them out, our seniors now were sophomores, and we were two very similar teams,” Christensen said. “I don't think we knew then we'd end up where we are now.”

Last season in a first-round rematch in Richland, Jake Sherfey scored on a 1-yard touchdown run on the game's final play to lift the Jaguars to a 13-10 victory over Toledo.

That was the Riverhawks' last loss. Both coaches admit the 2B Central League champions are a much different team this fall,

particularly Eli Weeks, who is a 2,000-yard passing, 1,000-yard rushing quarterback.

“He's a completely different quarterback — and a completely different threat for defenses,” Christensen said.

1B CHAMPIONSHIP PREVIEW

As if No. 1 seed DeSales and No. 2 seed Liberty Christian don't see each other consistently enough during the 1B Southeast League season, recently they've ramped up their rivalry series.

Twice in the past three seasons, they have met a second time in the WIAA playoffs.

And they will again Friday on the biggest stage — Husky Stadium — for the Class 1B title at Gridiron Classic.

"They have a great program," DeSales coach Josh Richard said. "And I'm sure they feel like they have some unfinished business from last year."

Liberty Christian came into the 2024 State Championship game as the No. 1 seed in its matchup against Wilbur-Creston-Keller. But the Wildcats prevailed, 42-34.

The Patriots returned as the preseason No. 1 team in 1B — and held that spot until they were tripped up by DeSales, 36-28, in late October. The Irish snapped a five-game series skid.

"We coached ourselves out of the game by installing a fancy defensive game plan that we thought would be tricky," Liberty Christian coach Craig Lukins said. "What it did was force our kids to play slow."

"Our plan now is to keep it as simple as we can."

Once a Class 2B powerhouse in the 1990s with four WIAA titles that decade, DeSales is trying to add a first 1B championship to its ledger. Quarterback Cohen Wood and the Irish passing attack has been one of the best in eight-man football all season.

Something Liberty Christian knows all too well.

"For the last four years, I have felt (DeSales) was underrated,"

Lukins said. "We thought they would take a step back this year with who they lost, but obviously they didn't. They are really good. They are balanced. And Cohen can throw the ball."
